Last week, the **Healthy MEDIA Commission** convened its first meeting at NCTA headquarters in Washington, DC. The Commission is comprised of media leaders and subject matter experts, with a goal of creating implementable ideas and recommendations for promoting positive media images of women and girls. The co-chairs of the Commission are **Geena Davis**, Academy-Award-winning actor and founder of the Geena Davis Institute on Gender in Media, and **Deborah Taylor Tate**, former FCC Commissioner. The primary partners of the Commission are Girl Scouts of the USA, NCTA, The Geena Davis Institute, NAB, and The Creative Coalition.

WICT's President & CEO **Maria Brennan** serves on the Commission, as do WICT Board members **Salaam Coleman Smith**, President of The Style Network, and **Ellen East**, Chief Communications Officer of Time Warner Cable. Maria Brennan was one of the featured speakers during last week's inaugural meeting. She addressed the topic of how to develop more women in media with leadership and decision-making responsibility, focusing on WICT's proven track record of success in her remarks.

The Healthy MEDIA Commission will meet periodically over the next year before releasing its findings next October.
